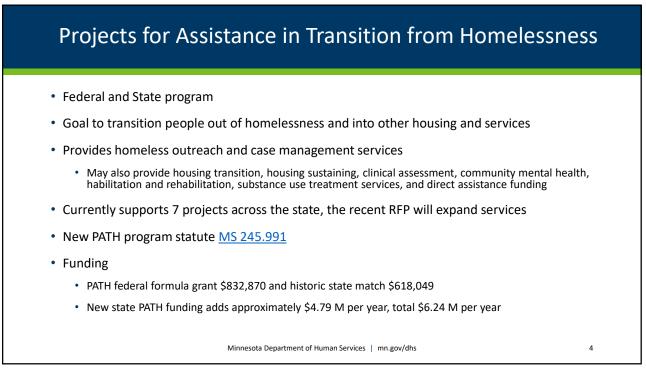

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Behavioral Health Homeless and Housing Programs
<ul> <li>PATH, HSASMI, and Crisis Housing Assistance programs serve people with serious mental illness, or co-occurring serious mental illness and substance use disorder</li> <li>Serious mental illness is defined as a mental illness "that seriously limits a person's capacity to function in primary aspects of daily living such as personal relations, living arrangements, work, and recreation." (Minn. Stat. § 245.462, subd. 20(a))</li> <li>Align with the Comprehensive Adult Mental Health Act housing mission statement (MS 245.461):</li> <li>Subd. 4. Housing mission statement. The commissioner shall ensure that the housing services provided as part of a comprehensive mental health service system:         <ul> <li>(1) allow all persons with mental illness to live in stable, affordable housing, in settings that maximize community integration and opportunities for acceptance;</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<ul><li>(2) allow persons with mental illness to actively participate in the selection of their housing from those living environments available to the general public; and</li><li>(3) provide necessary support regardless of where persons with mental illness choose to live.</li></ul>
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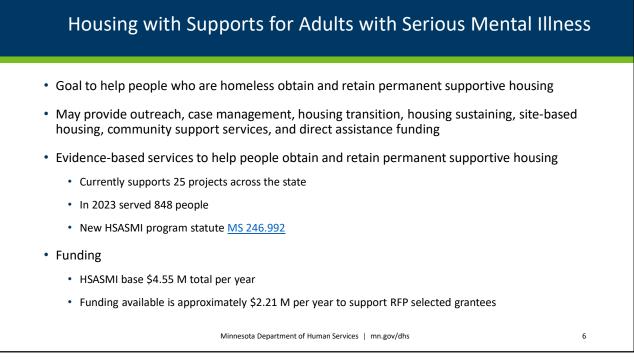
## PATH Program Outcomes

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- Number of individuals to whom the grantee provided homeless outreach services
  - In 2021 outreach contacted 2,291 people
- Number of individuals the grantee enrolled in case management services
  - In 2021 case management served 874 people
- Number of individuals that were able to access mental health and substance use disorder treatment services
  - Community mental health services 365 (41.8%) referred and 291 (33.3%) accessed
  - Substance use treatment services 73 (8.4%) referred and 44 (5%) accessed
- Number of individuals that were able to transition from homelessness to housing
  - Permanent housing 161 (18.4%) referred and 113 (12.9%) accessed

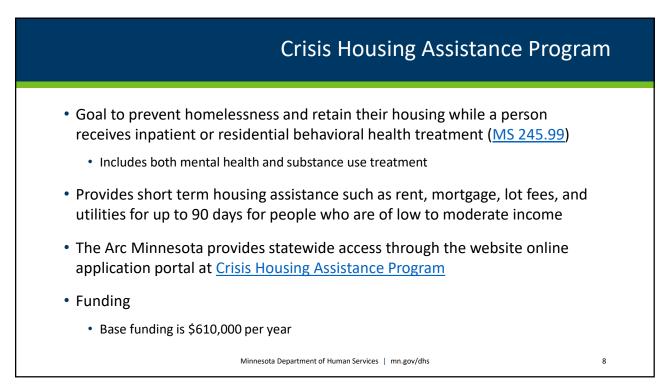
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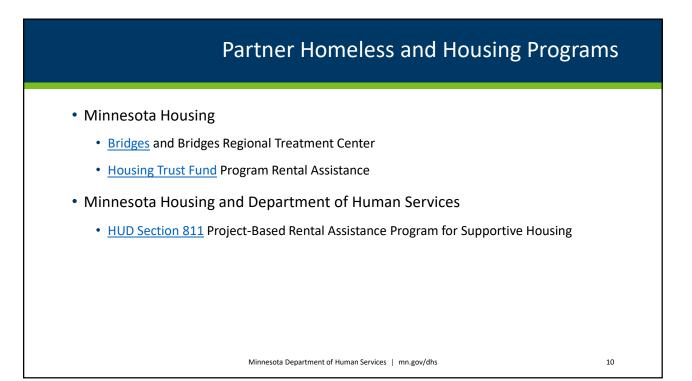
## Crisis Housing Assistance Program Data

## Utilization

- 238 applications submitted in 2023
- 183 applications were funded
- 39 were withdrawn
- Average monthly income \$1,220
- Average household size 1.55
- Demographic
  - Average age 38, youngest 20, oldest 67
  - Gender Female 63%, Male 35%, Transgender/X 2%

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




The Opioid Response Service team oversees grants from two predominant programs:		
1) The Federally-funded State Opioid Response (SOR) program	2) The State-funded Opioid Epidemic Response Advisory Council (OERAC) grants and initiatives	
<ul> <li>Purpose: to address the public health crisis caused by escalating opioid misuse, opioid use disorder (OUD), and opioid-related overdose across Minnesota.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Mission: To develop and implement a comprehensive and effective statewide effort to address the opioid addiction and overdose epidemic in Minnesota.</li> </ul>	
Objectives: SOR funds are used to:	Funding priorities: OERAC funds are used to:	
<ol> <li>increase access to U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-approved medications for the treatment of opioid use disorder (MOUD);</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Preventing Opioid Use Disorder</li> <li>Harm Reduction and Education on Opioid Overdose</li> </ol>	
<ol> <li>support the continuum of prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery support services for OUD and other concurrent substance use disorders; and</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Workforce Development</li> <li>Expansion and Enhancement of Care</li> </ol>	
<ol> <li>support the continuum of care for stimulant misuse and use disorders, including those involving cocaine and methamphetamine.</li> </ol>	5. Chronic Pain and Alternative Treatments
