MINNESOTA HOUSING

The purpose of this document is to help owners and managers of affordable multifamily housing access clean energy resources and programs. This list may not be comprehensive of every available program but serves as a resource for commonly used programs.

Utility Incentive Programs

Minnesota Energy Resources – Multifamily Energy Savings Program

The Multifamily Energy Savings Program is designed specifically to address the needs of multifamily building owners. This program includes the direct installation of high-efficiency showerheads and faucet aerators where appropriate to the buildings' operations. Additional opportunities for energy savings will be evaluated, including: assessment of centralized heating systems; building operations opportunities, such as boiler control settings; flow measurements and diagnosis of central ventilation systems; a customized energy report with recommendations; follow up assistance with high-value savings opportunities; rebate incentives for energy-efficiency measures most common to multifamily buildings. All of this is at no cost. The program covers all materials and time, no matter how large your building. To get started call 888.734.6365.

Ottertail Power – House Therapy

The House Therapy program can help make your home more efficient and help cut costs on your monthly energy bills. The House Therapy program offers free energy-saving services to replace inefficient appliances and weatherize homes for qualified customers as well as for low-income multifamily buildings and homes.

Xcel Energy and CenterPoint Energy – Home Energy Squad

The Home Energy Squad Program includes a professional inspection of single family homes and townhomes, as well as the installation of energy-saving measures, which include (as applicable): LED bulbs; programmable thermostat installation and program set up; door and attic hatch weather stripping; high-efficiency showerhead and faucet aerators; water heater temperature assessment and adjustment; attic and wall insulation inspection; blower door test; thermal image testing; combustion safety test; carbon monoxide check. Program cost is dependent on location and income limits. The program will also help participants access applicable rebates for larger projects.

Xcel Energy and CenterPoint Energy – Multi-Family Building Efficiency Program

The Multi-Family Building Efficiency Program is designed to focus on whole-building energy improvements—in both common and residential areas—wherever the most potential savings are identified. Participants receive a free energy audit to uncover whole-building improvement potentials. They will also receive free, energy-saving installations, including: screw-in LED lights in common areas; LED lights in resident units; water-saving showerheads; water-saving faucet aerators; water heater blanket; LEDs in exit signs. General Tips for Working with Utilities

We recommend calling your local utility company directly to inquire about rebates and other utility incentive programs for multifamily buildings, as utility websites and other databases may not have the most recent information available.

If your utility does not have a dedicated multifamily program, your project will likely still qualify for a mixture of residential and commercial rebates and programs. Additional incentives specifically for qualified low-income customers and buildings may also be available.

Solar Programs

Ottertail Power – Publicly Owned Property Solar

Ottertail Power provide cash incentives to publicly owned facilities that install non-residential solar photovoltaic (PV) systems. Publicly owned facilities receive \$1,500/kilowatt (kW) of installed solar PV nameplate (AC) capacity—up to 50% of project costs—for systems 40 kW or less in size based on AC nameplate capacity. This is a valuable program for tax-exempt public entities, which typically don't qualify for the 30% federal tax credit for installing solar-powered systems.

Property Assessed Clean Energy

Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) makes energy efficiency upgrades and renewable energy investments more attainable to commercial building owners. PACE financing is a fit for most industries including farms, commercial office buildings, nonprofit organizations (including places of worship), and multi-tenant buildings. Common investments include solar panels, HVAC systems, lighting, motors, and more.
