





Equitable Housing

- Initiated in 2021 due to families coming to the CAIRO Office with housing concerns (Community Needs).
- Started with small advocacy efforts and assistance with paperwork.
- Established a partnership with Mid Minnesota Legal Aid for legal consultations and eviction help.
- Expanded Housing Services to include rent and utility assistance through MN Housing Finance Agency (October 2023–present). MN Housing has allocated \$2,120.470 to support families experiencing Homelessness in Central MN. This funding has enabled us to support families and individuals with rental and utility payment, have dedicated staff to do housing case management, do advocacy work, partner with local property owners and do resource referral to other FHPAP providers, CAP agencies and counties.
- Began hosting tenant Listening Sessions.
- Improved relationships with local landlords.

Success Story

Client being denied to move into their rented unit upon the lease signature because the apartment was not ready.

CAIRO intervened, threatened with police call,

finally, landlord accommodated the family and offered them temporary housing until their unit was ready.

HOUSING ACCESS & STABILITY



LANDLORD-TENANT LISTENING SESSIONS

Facilitated sessions between landlords & tenants aimed at resolving disputes & improving communication.

33 Sessions



NEGOTIATION & ADVOCACY

Staff and volunteer hours spent facilitating negotiations between landlords and tenants.




Workforce Housing Project
